The Horn Program offers an undergraduate minor in Entrepreneurial Studies and a major in Entrepreneurship & Technology Innovation (ENTI). We also offer an MBA concentration and graduate certificate in ENTI, as well as an M.S. in Entrepreneurship & Design.

Startup eXperience

The Startup eXperience is the Horn Program's premier educational opportunity. It is comprised of two courses in which student teams attempt to conceive, validate and launch high growth potential businesses.

VentureOn

VentureOn supports student businesses by providing the resources they need to hatch and grow, including 24/7 access to shared office and meeting space, advisory and other in-kind services, connections and more.

Hen Hatch

Hen Hatch is the University of Delaware's premier startup funding competition. All university students, alumni, faculty and staff are eligible to submit business concepts and compete for a share of cash and in-kind prizes valued at \$50,000+.





Venture Development Center (VDC)

The VDC is a 5,000-square-foot, state-of-the-art facility that serves as the home for the entrepreneurial community on campus and an applied learning laboratory for students. It houses staff and many of the Horn Program's signature offerings and events.

Fast Forward

Fast Forward mixes students and faculty with alumni and members of the broader entrepreneurial community. It features five-minute, five-slide presentations by entrepreneurs, inventors and community leaders who are shaping the future.



Diamond Challenge

The Diamond Challenge for High School Entrepreneurs is an educational business concept competition in which U.S. and international students develop, test and pitch new business ideas while vying for a share of the Challenge's \$25,000 prize pool.
